

Generous support by our community has made it possible to provide a variety of support services to children and adults with Down Syndrome and their families.



# Exec's Corner



This week Board Member, Sara Wolff, and I have the privilege of attending The Arc of The United States National Convention in Denver Colorado. This is an opportunity to experience a network of many as most of the 600 Arc Chapters across the country will participate. We hope to learn how some are utilizing

cutting edge approaches to services, addressing issues that confront us, and most importantly, how we can best advocate together for children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families. Both Sara and I are grateful for this honor.

Years ago, just out of college, I became a direct service professional with The Arc. I had little knowledge of The Arc and less understanding of services available for our family members and friends with developmental disabilities. It was important then, as it is now, that each of us understand the power of The Arc across the country and the privilege of being part of this organization.

Similar to The Arc of Northeastern Pennsylvania, The Arc of the United States was founded in 1950 by a group of parents who wanted more for their children with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Their is no group more passionate then parents. These parents believed that " their children with disabilities deserved more—to be included in their communities and to pursue fulfillment and happiness just like everyone else." In the 1950s the predominant recommendation for families caring for child with disabilities was institutionalization. There were no special education classrooms or community supports. The road ahead was clear.

Today, The Arc of The United States is the largest national community based organization advocating for and with people with intellectual and developmental disabilities. The Arc envisions that every individual and family living with I/DD in the United States has access to information, advocacy, and skills they need to support their full inclusion and participation in the community in the lifetimes. For over 70 years The Arc has played a pivotal role in changing the public perception of disability. As parents organized around kitchen table, families fought for the right for full inclusion. The Arc of The United States continues to work tirelessly on public policy. The combined strength of The Arc of The United States and the individual chapters across the county is NUMBER ONE in shaping, expanding and protecting the federal role that provides vital benefits, and services to assure the civil rights for the children and adults we support.

As a member, volunteer or employee of The Arc, you are part of The Arc of The United States and the largest nationwide, grassroots dedication to the right of a full and respected life for children and adults with IDD. This is a powerful honor.

### **Please Meet Katie Foley**



Hello, my name is Katie Foley and I am the newest advocate at The Arc of NEPA. My educational background is in Communications, Elementary Education, and Theater. Currently, I teach a class for adults with special needs acting class for The Gathering Place in Clarks Summit with the intent of socialization and emotional regulation all done through acting and improvisational exercises. I am also a founding member of the parent group, ALIGN for parents of children with Autism, also at The Gathering Place. I had formed the group with 2 others I had met after having written a children's book for my son with Autism called, You May Never Be French. I wanted to look at Autism through a cultural lens, something that many of us can relate to. I have also written articles for Autism Parenting Magazine about the importance of Theater for children and adults with Autism and other learning disabilities as well as articles on safety and the importance of trusting ourselves as parents. I have also written a book for my daughter who also struggles with learning disabilities.

Prior to my life as a parent I worked at PBS in Bethlehem, as the Engineering Facilitator, where again, communication and listening were key to the success of my department. For a short time, I also simultaneously worked for Lehigh University's lacocca Institute, where I learned from the best communicators and leaders in business about the importance of truly hearing others in order to more fully succeed. I am also a volunteer for Special Olympics and The Carbondale Chamber of Commerce's Arts Alliance. My most significant accomplishment however, is that I am the parent of 2 amazing children with IEPs and learning disabilities who teach me new things about myself each and every day. I have always seen communication as the most important tool for any person, especially for those who may feel unheard. As an advocate, my hope is to bring all that The Arc of NEPA represents to our Luzerne County community.

I am currently working on bringing the SibShops, a part of the Sibling Support project to the area, having been fully certified in the program. I feel that siblings are as much a part of advocacy as parents are and I want to make sure that we support them. I am also hoping to bring awareness to issues that affect our intellectually disabled community in a big way, such as sexual health and relationship boundaries. I am striving to bring back the LIU 18 Right to Education Taskforce and hope to facilitate conversations between our educators and our parents to bring about change through cooperation.

The strongest foundations always have more pillars of parents, selfadvocates, educators and invested community members which is the best way to grow the message of The Arc of Northeastern Pennsylvania, to promote human rights through the support of full inclusion and participation in their communities. Visions are always clearer when we remove the filters that separate us. I hope to bring the support, mission and influence of The Arc to assist our communities throughout Northeastern Pennsylvania, but most especially to Luzerne County. There are so many wonderfully supportive programs and educators in Luzerne already helping those with disabilities. I aim to support them even more in all that they do, while bringing the mission of Advocacy that The Arc represents to all of Luzerne County.


