It is a festive time of year and we are thrilled to be able to share it with all of you.











Mike Munchak Community Service Scholarship

The United Way of Lackawanna and Wayne Counties has established the Mike Munchak Community Service Scholarship program to assist high school students from Lackawanna, Wayne and Pike Counties (PA) who plan to pursue a post-secondary education. The 2025 recipient will receive a one-time award of \$6,300 to commemorate Mike's #63 which he wore throughout his playing days and which was retired by the Houston Oilers in 1996.

To be eligible, candidates must be actively involved in community service activities in programs funded by this United Way, be a full-time resident and/or student of school districts within Lackawanna or Wayne Counties and accepted by an accredited university, college or trade school, in a two or four year degree program track, for the 2020/21 school year.

PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA AND HIGHLIGHTS

- The scholarship amount for 2025 is \$6,300.00.
- The scholarship will be awarded for a one (1) year period only.
- Open only to graduating seniors within our school districts.
- Demonstrate commitment through community service activities.
- Demonstrate academic achievement

• Applicants must be graduating seniors from a public, private, parochial or charter school within their counties

Credentialed Employees

The Arc of Northeastern Pennsylvania, in partnership with the National Alliance of Direct Support Professionals (NADSP), is proud to announce a new career development and credentialing program. The Arc of NEPA has established this credentialing program with NADSP in an effort to recognize the vital work of Direct Support Professionals (DSP) and Front Line Supervisors (FLS), strengthen our commitment to quality standards, and improve our employee recruitment and retention efforts. Through the NADSP E-Badge Academy, The Arc of NEPA Direct Support Professionals and Front Line Supervisors have the ability to earn national certification through stackable electronic badges. These badges, earned by achieving a minimum number of hours of training, practicums and a portfolio, demonstrate the knowledge, skills, and values that DSPs and FLSs utilize every

day, recognizing the professional development that might otherwise go unacknowledged. Employees who fulfill the requirements of the certification receive an hourly merit increase, along with a one-time monetary bonus (if completed prior to March 31, 2025).



10 Ways you can celebrate IDD Awareness month with The Arc of NEPA can help!

in lead roles in movies. Pick one to watch with someone and help change their perception of what individuals with IDD can do. The Arc of NEPA even hosts documentary screenings and would love to have you join us!

6. Spread Awareness – Share positive stories about the accomplishments of individuals with disabilities. There isn't a shortage impactful stories out there that showcase talents and achievements of those who continue to defy outdated stereotypes.
